

Community-Based Grants for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (CBCAP):

Funding Agency/Organization: U.S. Department of Health and Human Services - Administration on Children, Youth and Families. Children's Bureau, Office on Child Abuse and Neglect

Federal Law Code Reference: The CAPTA Reauthorization Act of 2010; Title II of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act

Purpose of CBCAP Grant: The purposes of the CBCAP program are: (1) to support community-based efforts to develop, operate, expand, enhance, and coordinate initiatives, programs, and activities to prevent child abuse and neglect and to support the coordination of resources and activities to better strengthen and support families to reduce the likelihood of child abuse and neglect; and (2) to foster understanding, appreciation and knowledge of diverse populations in order to effectively prevent and treat child abuse and neglect.

Georgia's Formula Funding Allocation:

Base funding level for Georgia - \$801,360 – Leveraged state funds could bring in an additional \$50,000 - \$150,000 each year. FY 2014 grant award amount is \$801,360.

Budget Requirements: 20% State cash match

CBCAP Programs: CBCAP supports statewide initiatives that strengthen and support infrastructure development for child abuse and neglect prevention. Proposals, budgets and deliverables are received for these performance-based contracts.
