- No RIFS or Furloughs
- No Office Closures
- No Reduction in Vacant Foster Care Support Services Positions
- No Reduction to After School Care Programs
- No Reduction to DBHDD Contracted Substance Abuse Services
- Limited Reduction to CASA (from \$506,800 to \$35,796)

FY 2021 Budget | Highlights

- Budget Reductions (\$28,926,378)
 - Adjust Gateway/GETS budget based on SFY19 (\$16,794,225)
 - Adjust Out-of-Home Care based on Utilization (\$7,436,426)
 - 18 TANF contracts w/community partnerships (\$3,138,041)
 - Elimination of the Child Abuse Registry (\$975,000)
 - 0.58% Reduction in Child Care Institution Provider Rates (582,686)
- Contract Reduction Elimination (\$5,897,760)
 - GSU Child Welfare Policy Institute Contract (\$2,000,000)
 - MAAC Contract for Education Services (R14)—(\$1,903,400)
 - GSU Professional Excellence Contract (\$1,000,310)
 - GCAPP Contract (\$994,050)
