- 1. Board Considers Motion to Publish Proposed Rule
- 2. 30-Day Public Comment Period
- 3. Public Hearing
- 4. Motion for Final Adoption of Proposed Rule
- 5. Submit Final Rule to Secretary of State

Final – Safe Place for Newborns

Act Provides Immunity from Prosecution When an Infant Child is Given to Participating Medical Facility, Police Station or Fire Station

O.C.G.A. § 19-10A-8 Requires DHS to Create Standards for Signs

Alerting Public of Safe Haven Locations

Current Rule Effective November 1, 2018

Current Rule:

- 290-1-9-.01
- Contains basic language

Rule Published October 6 – November 5

Proposed Change:

- Provides more detail
- DHS to also amend logo
- Aligns with national efforts
- Allows use of previous signs




Final - Safe Place for Newborns



SAFE HAVEN SITE

THIS IS A SAFE PLACE FOR NEWBORNS LOCATION



If you are in crisis and feel you need to leave your newborn in the care and custody of the state, please find a staff member to assist you. The Georgia Safe Place for Newborns Act allows a child's mother to leave her baby, up to 30 days old, with an employee of this facility.

You may remain anonymous.

Effective Date December 2020



Final – Regulatory Reduction Effort

Executive Branch agencies asked to review any rules that could be safely eliminated or reduced for the benefit of all Georgians.

DHS identified ~ 505 rules no longer related to DHS responsibilities or functions.

- 290-1-7 Y2K
- 290-4 Mental health, developmental disabilities, and addictive diseases
- 290-5 Public Health
- 290-9-37 Community Living Arrangements

Rules Published October 6 – November 5

Proposed Change:

- Addressed these rules with the Departments of Community Health, Public Health, and Behavioral Health & Developmental Disabilities
- To be eliminated from DHS rule chapters

Final – Child Caring Institutions

Rule changes needed to streamline regulations, move private foster home placements under CPA license, and comply with Governor Kemp's regulatory reduction effort

Proposed Changes:

- Updates terms, provisions, statutory references
- Deletes rules and references to private foster home placements
- Clarifies exemption from licensure requirement for government owned and operated programs
- New rule requires CCI to obtain CPA license to continue placing children in private foster homes

- Updates food service provisions
- Clarifies waiver and variance provisions
- Clarifies that pandemic and infectious disease outbreaks are reportable
- Adds requirements to disaster preparedness plans concerning pandemic or infectious disease outbreaks
