1. Board Considers Motion to Publish Proposed Rule
2. 30-Day Public Comment Period
3. Public Hearing
4. Motion for Final Adoption of Proposed Rule
5. Send Final Rule to Secretary of State

Child Protective Services Information System (Child Abuse Registry)

- Background: The Child Abuse Registry was codified in 2015 and went into effect on July 1, 2016.
- Legislative Update: This year the Georgia General Assembly passed HB 993, the Act was signed by Governor Kemp on June 30, 2020, and went into effect on July 1, 2020.
- HB 993 or Act 410 repealed Georgia's Child Abuse Registry.
- The proposal is the elimination of all DHS rules involving the previously enacted Child Protective Services Information System – Georgia's Child Abuse Registry.
