Rule Change Procedure

- 1. Board Considers Motion to Publish Proposed Rule
- 2. 30-Day Public Comment Period
- 3. Public Hearing
- 4. Motion for Final Adoption of Proposed Rule
- 5. Send Final Rule to Secretary of State



Initial – Safe Place for Newborns

Act Provides Immunity from Prosecution When an Infant Child is Given to Participating Medical Facility, Police Station or Fire Station

O.C.G.A. § 19-10A-8 Requires DHS to Create Standards for Signs

Alerting Public of Safe Haven Locations

Current Rule Effective November 1, 2018

Current Rule:

- 290-1-9.01
- Contains basic language

Rule Published February 17 – March 18

Proposed Change:

- Provides more detail
- DHS to also amend logo
- Aligns with national efforts
- Allows use of previous signs
