ADRC/NWD Systems Business Case Development

Project Purpose:

- 1. Assess current efforts in establishing a business case for NWD systems
- 2. Work with ACL and partners to develop method to calculate return on investment (ROI)
- 3. Share data with ACL to calculate ROI on a national level
- 4. Produce a business case model that demonstrates impact of NWD system

Deliverables:

- Options Counseling to **100** individuals

- Facility-based Options Counseling to **1000** individuals
- Non-Medicaid transitions for **330** individuals
