  - Liaisons to AAAs
  - ADRC Access Points

# NWD Systems Grant

## ADRC/NWD Systems Business Case Development

### Project Purpose:

1. Assess current efforts in establishing a business case for NWD systems
2. Work with ACL and partners to develop method to calculate return on investment (ROI)
3. Share data with ACL to calculate ROI on a national level
4. Produce a business case model that demonstrates impact of NWD system

# Year One

**Funding: \$502,154**

**Project Period: 09/01/2018-08/31/2019**

## **Deliverables:**

- Options Counseling to **75** individuals
- Support Options to **20** individuals
- Person-centered training to **138** individuals



# Year Two

**Funding: \$577,885**

**Project Period: 09/01/2019-08/31/2020**

## **Deliverables:**

- Options Counseling to **100** individuals
- Support Options to **25** individuals
- Person-centered training to **138** individuals



# Deliverables Across Both Years

- Facility-based Options Counseling to **1000** individuals
- Non-Medicaid transitions for **330** individuals



# Final Report

- Demonstrate financial and quality of life outcomes
  - Return on investment, consumer satisfaction
- Available to stakeholders and posted on DHS DAS website
- Shared at regional and national conferences
- Strategic planning locally and statewide
