Rule Change Procedure

- 1. Board Considers Motion to Publish Proposed Rule
- 2. 30-Day Public Comment Period
- 3. Public Hearing
- 4. Motion for Final Adoption of Proposed Rule
- 5. Send Final Rule to Secretary of State



Rule 290-2-31 Respite Care Greater than 72 hours

The rule is needed to provide guidance regarding respite of children in foster care when the caregiver needs respite for more than 72 hours

Proposed Rule:

 Allows for and provides a process for caregivers to give notice of their intent to use respite care for more than 72 consecutive hours to the Division of Family and Children Services and provides a process for appropriate screening of the respite caregiver.
