 - Seek administrative sanctions, civil recoveries and/ or criminal prosecution of those responsible for fraud, waste and abuse in DHS programs and offices



- The OIG is currently comprised of five distinct units:

Background Investigations Unit

- Criminal Records Section
 - Employees
 - Contractors

- Electronic Fingerprints Section
 - Performs Statewide travel
 - IMPACT Classes
 - Courtesy Reviews of Criminal
 History Record Information



Residential Child Care Unit

- Monitors, inspects, licenses
 - Child Caring Institutions
 - Outdoor Child Caring Programs
 - Child Placing and Adoption Agencies
 - Children's Transitional Care Centers
 - Maternity Homes

- Responsible for
 - Initial and Annual Inspections
 - Follow-up Inspections
 - Investigation of complaints
 - Imposing Adverse Actions

Benefits Recovery Unit

- Four Investigative Quads
 - Food Stamp
 - TANF
- Child Care and Parent Services (CAPS) Investigative Unit

- Claims and Collections
 - Establishes non-fraud Food Stamp and TANF claims in the ten most populous counties
 - Responsible for collection activities on all Food Stamp and TANF claims established in the State
 - Collections are made through the Federal Treasury Offset Program, State Debt Offset Program, and the reduction of public assistance benefits



Internal Investigations Unit

- Employee Misconduct
- Fraud, Waste, and Abuse in DHS programs

- Contractor Misconduct
- Serves as a liaison to external law enforcement



Internal Audits Unit

Performs

- Internal financial and compliance audits of DHS programs to provide information regarding fiscal and program activity
- Makes recommendations for corrective actions and monitors agency response
- Performs similar audit work in support of GVRA

- Third Party Reviews of audits and financial statements performed by private sector auditors on organizations that receive departmental funds
- Serves as DHS liaison with state and federal auditors to ensure timely and accurate responses are made to audits performed on the department by others
