# Office of the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman (OSLTCO)

- Independent office of DHS
- Program expenditures Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2018: \$2.7M state and federal funds
- Six state office staff
- Approximately 43 local staff


#### OSLTCO provides:

- Technical assistance to local representatives
- Training to local representatives
- Data collection, analysis and reporting
- Information and assistance



#### LTCO Coverage

- 6 non-profit agencies
- Approx. 43 Ombudsman Representatives (OR)
- Approx. 30 Volunteers

### **Unique Characteristics**

- Confidentiality Ombudsman Representatives (ORs) not mandated reporters
- Investigation focus resident's perception
- Resolution resident satisfaction
- Individual advocacy and systemic advocacy

40,634 NH residents
39,672 Other LTC facilities

#### How we serve

- Seek resolution of resident problems
- Advocate for resident rights
- Routinely visit facilities
- Monitor conditions
- Educate facility staff
- Provide information and consultation
- Collaborate with other agencies



### Access is reciprocal

 Residents must have access to LTCOR

LTCOR must have access to residents

 Regulations provide for sanctions for willful interference with LTCOR



## **Resident's Rights**

- Dignity and Respect
- Rights of every citizen
- Participate in planning and implementation of care
- Choice of physician
- Information medical records
- Communication phone, mail
- Privacy
- Self-determination
- Visitors




#### **Promote Person-Centered Care**

#### Incorporate personal preferences

- Wake-up and bed time choice
- Mealtimes offer more alternative choices: appetizers, beverages, condiments
- Shower/bathing times flexible time of day, days of week
- Meaningful and purposeful activities




#### **Common Complaints**






## FFY 2018 Complaints – Nursing Homes




## **Systems Advocacy**
